amodex® quick stain solutions

- 1** Check for colorfastness
- 2** DO NOT WET STAIN BEFORE APPLYING AMODEX
- 3** For ink stains, place paper towel beneath stain to avoid transfer
- 4** Shake bottle well
- 5** Apply Amodex to stain
- 6** Rub in well with fingernail or brush
- 7** Rinse or launder

NOTE: Any yellowing of stained area after treating with Amodex is dried Amodex residue. No worries - simply rinse again thoroughly.

HEAVY INK STAINS

1. Place paper towel under stain.
2. Apply **amodex®** to stain.
3. Gently rub with brush or paper towel.
4. As stain transfers to paper towel, rotate towel to a clean area and continue rubbing.
5. Continue working the stained area until NO ink appears on the paper towel.
6. Launder in a regular laundry load or rinse thoroughly under faucet using warm water. Continue rubbing area while rinsing.

Very heavy ink spots, especially those in pockets and along seams, take patience to remove. Although we don't guarantee that **amodex®** will always remove heavy ink spots, we know and assure you that it is your most effective choice.

SPECIAL APPLICATIONS

- POROUS SURFACES** (plastic, walls, etc) absorb stains.
- Coat the area with **amodex®** and leave on overnight
 - Wipe clean with damp rag
- BERRY STAINS:** **amodex®** turns berry/wine stains blue – this is a normal phase of stain removal
- Apply **amodex®** and continue rubbing until light
 - Rinse or launder
- STUBBORN/PRETREATED STAINS** may be set and difficult to remove
- Apply **amodex®** and rub in well with brush or fingernail
 - Leave on overnight or several days, then rinse or launder
 - Repeat application while still wet. Be patient & persistent

amodex® STAIN REMOVAL TIPS

- Stains DO NOT have to be treated immediately – take your time. Amodex will remove stains that have been there for weeks provided nothing has been applied.
- When used as your FIRST line of defense, Amodex works best on fresh or untreated stains.
- As a soap formula, Amodex MUST be rubbed in well, and rinsed.
- Amodex is great for “ring around the collar” and safe for spot treating. Just apply, rub in, and leave on the fabric until ready to launder.
- Using alcohol, hair spray, acetone, etc. sets ink, so don't use them on stains.
